

Oops! Canberra Airport did it again!



At the 28 February 2007 public meeting held in the Jerrabomberra Community Hall, Canberra Airport representative Stephen Byron told Jerrabomberra residents that housing at Tralee would result in noise sharing for the people of Jerrabomberra, Queanbeyan and Canberra.

Mr Byron said this even though he received a letter just three days before the February meeting from Gary Nairn MP.

Gary Nairn said, *"...irrespective of the NSW Government's planning decision, flight paths and noise abatement zones around the Canberra International Airport will not change..."*

Gary Nairn also said that Federal Transport Minister Mark Vaile confirmed these comments.
